AN UPDATE FROM OUR BOARD OF TRUSTEES

Kia ora to our Rutherford Whanau and Kaimahi,

Welcome to Term 2! We hope that everyone had a good term break after a very busy start to the year.

Here's a little summary of the board's recent activities:

We are preparing our annual report to the Ministry of Education. The report provides a summary of the schools' strategic plan, student achievement targets and progress, employment policy and financial statements and audit for the prior year (2023). The final version will be published on the school's website.

The school has developed a new logo that incorporates our school culture, history and values. You will notice the new logo being progressively rolled out on letterheads, signage, newsletters and certificates. There are plans to incorporate the new logo into the new building which will be exciting to see. A big thanks to those members of the board and our school community who helped with the design of the new logo.

We are working on developing a new policy which offers optional exit interviews to departing staff.

We considered quotes for the installation of carpet in the hall. An installer has been selected and the installation will take place later in the year. The carpet will improve the acoustics and insulation in the hall and will be more comfortable for tamariki to sit on during assemblies.

The fundraising subcommittee has met to discuss ideas for this year. A car boot sale, Matariki disco and raffle are planned for

Our school will be hosting the Te Kahu te Rēhia Kapa Haka competition with the support Rutherford College as a venue in November. Amanda successfully applied for a grant to cover the hire costs of a suitable stage for this event. The school will looking for volunteers to assist with the day later this term.

The new classroom build is progressing well, with completion estimated to be in September. Board members were given an opportunity to attend the walk-through sessions in Term 1. It is looking amazing!

We are investigating development of a landscape concept plan for the school. If you have skills in this area or know of someone that we could approach for quotes, we would love to hear from you.

ATTENDANCE AT RUTHERFORD

Attending school every day unless sick makes a big difference to children's progress and social connection with their friends.

Our aim is to have all children at school at least 90% of the time. This means that children will have no more than 5 days off school each 10 week term. You will be contacted if attendance slips beyond 90%.

Please remember to contact us if your child is going to be absent. We need to code your child's roll according to the Ministry of Educations' guidelines.

SCHOOL ABSENCES

If your child is going to be absent from school for any reason please choose one of the following options:

If the school is not informed of your child's absence/s they will be marked as truant.

HOLIDAYS DURING TERM TIME

Include the dates you will be absent. We will pre-code your child's attendance for those days.

These will be coded as an explained but unjustified absence.

LATE TO SCHOOL

Students who arrive after **8.50am MUST report to the** school office to sign in.



Please make your child aware that if they arrive after the bell has gone, they must report to the office to sign in avoiding the need to get in touch with parents.

LEAVING SCHOOL EARLY

Children are not permitted to leave the school grounds unless accompanied by a parent/caregiver.

The teacher and office staff must be informed and the child signed out before leaving the school grounds.

CHANGE OF ADDRESS OR DETAILS

It's really important to get in touch with you in an emergency. Please let us know any changes to your address, phone number or caregivers so we can keep our records up to date.

Helmets
